Message from the President

I would like to share with you two recent experiences that highlight how BPW women today are bold women. Courageous women. Empowered Women Leading Business. I have no doubt that this triennium will be a "landmark triennium for gender issues" and BPW members are the trailblazers creating history at a time where new levels of leadership are required to drive economic growth and harness the power of emerging markets through greater diversity.

The first experience was being part of the Global Platform on Sourcing from Women Vendors meeting and the inaugural Buyers-Mentor meeting held in Chongqing, China. The meetings were an enormous success that actually put words and ideas into action delivering tangible results. BPW left its hallmark having been well represented at the high level meetings, plenary sessions and buyerment or group workshops. I was extremely pleased to lead a delegation of BPW members representing countries that included - U.S.A., Mongolia, Thailand, St Paolo, Australia and Turkey. Over \$14 million of trade opportunities were identified on the first day of meetings with further letters of intent signed. This is now the UN's biggest program on economic empowerment of women through trade and BPW is again in pioneer mode as weare part of this history making event!

Having left Chongqing, China, a few days ago, i am now in Ankara, Turkey, where I presented at a most successful BPW Turkey event. In another first for this country, the President of BPW Turkey, Arzu Ozyol, brought together the two political parties, high level bureaucrats, civil society organisations and academia at a breakfast meeting declaring that women's issues are not political issues and should not be used as a "political tool" to win elections. I shared views with the Minister of Family and Social P olicy, Fatma Sahin, and Former Minister of State for Women's Issues and Immediate Past President of the Parliament Commission for Equality, Guldal Aksit, on the need for determined leadership at this time - with all stakeholders working together.

The meeting was held at the newly restored restaurant at the women's ward of the Ulucanlar Prison, where political prisoners were once held. Under the breakfast theme, Women are Getting United in the Women Ward of Prison for other Women, the meeting called for continual sustainable efforts and cooperation in meeting the needs of women and recognising their rightful place in society. The event attracted a very strong media contingency with news stories in all the major newspapers, TV and radio. A tour of the prison with Minister Sahin followed. A most professional meeting of BPW Presidents was organised by BPW Turkey President, Arzu Ozyol later that afternoon.

Over coming weeks I will be visiting Sicily, Rome and Athens be fore returning to Australia where

I will be joining BPW Australia members and representing BPW International at the Commonwealth Business Forum (CBF) during the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) in Western Australia. Stay tuned for some exciting announcements!

Everyone plays a role. Everyone contributes. Everyone is part of achieving the gender balance we want to see in the marketplace, workplace and community. Go BPW - the time is ours. The time is now!!!!
